# Burntwood Rotary Club Fund Raising Activities Committee – Forward Plan for 2008/9

# The Committee's responsibilities and membership are as follows:

The Fund Raising Activities Committee is to identify and evaluate all available means of raising funds for the Club's charity account and then to take forward a 2-year programme of well-publicised and well-organised events that offer the most balanced and effective utilisation of the Club's available resources. The Forward Planning should cover both the current and the subsequent Presidential years and should include consulting the incoming President well in advance of the start of his year.

#### Chairman: Paul Ralph.

Members: Clive Cain, Roy Whittaker, Richard Poynton, Denis Robins and David Henn, with Honorary Members Peter Barke (District Governor) and John Spalding when at Club.

At the forward planning meeting on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> May 2008, the Committee set the following programme of fund raising activities:

- Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2008 Barbeque at Hammerwich Cricket Club. This will be an evening event with a bar and some form of entertainment. David Henn advised that he had two 9m by 3m gazebos that he could make available in case of inclement weather.
- Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> September 2008 Skittle Alley at Cannock Wood Country Fayre. This
  event will be staged using a mobile Skittle Alley loaned by David Henn. The main prize
  would be awarded to the highest score of the day.
- Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> November 2008 Frog Race at Hammerwich Cricket Club. This would be a joint venture with Hammerwich Cricket Club. The Cricket Club would run the bar and charge £25 for the heating. They would also make the kitchen available to enable the Rotary Club to provide a Baked Potato supper.
- March 2009 (date to be arranged) Variety Show at Drayton Manor. Considerable
  difficulties are being encountered in trying to locate a suitable venue so close to the
  planned date for the event, it may well be that planning for such major events needs to
  start well over twelve months in advance.
- 20<sup>th</sup> June 2009 Barn Dance in conjunction with Hammerwich Cricket Club. The Committee will liaise with Hammerwich Cricket Club to plan this joint event.

In addition, the following fund raising activities will continue as usual:

- Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> July 2008 Cars in the Park. The Club's role this year will be to collect entrance fees from all those attending the show at the three pedestrian entrances. The share of the proceeds for undertaking this role has not been defined as this is the first year that an entrance fee has been levied and it is therefore not possible to forecast the impact on revenues. However, the Club has been assured that it will receive a fair share of the income generated by the show (last year's share was £891, despite heavy rain badly depleting attendance, and the previous year's share had been £2,500).
- Tree of Light Opening Ceremony Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> November 2008: As is usual, the Tree of Light will be erected on Swan Island and the people of Burntwood will have the opportunity to make donations in memory of their loved ones. As last year's Tree of Light raised £660 for the Club's charity account, it is anticipated that this year's Tree of Light will raise a similar amount.
- Santa's Float Street Collections December 2008: The float will endeavour to match, or exceed, last year's record of £5,340.
