BLYTHE BRIDGE THE VILLAGE THAT GREW OUT OF ITSELF

The old A50 trunk road which passes through Blythe Bridge has seen many travellers through the Centuries, from the original Roman builders to the ox and cart, the horse and wagon, coaches and horses and the busy motor traffic of today. Next to agriculture the business of coaching inns put Blythe Bridge on the map. Later, with the arrival of the railway in 1848, a decline in road transport boosted property development in the Village. Steady growth between the two world wars gave Blythe Bridge a stable Village community with Church and Chapel firmly established and businesses expanding.

Successful Victorian and Edwardian businessmen settled in the Village in their large mansions and villas. Adamthwaite Drive — a semi circular road off the main A50 is typical of a brave but failed attempt at a large luxury development late in the 19th Century. The Village is perhaps somewhat unusual in that at one end of the Village is the Black Cock Public House and at the other the White Cock (where the Blythe Bridge and District Rotary Club holds its monthings).

Blythe Bridge has grown substantially as a dormitory residential area for the Potteries and is now a thriving local community rapidly building up its own groups and organisations as evidenced by the emergence of the Blythe Bridge and District Rotary Club.
